WEED CONTROL UPDATE

The October Director's meeting was dedicated to a discussion of our "nuisance weed problem". Expert guests were Rod Edgell, a biologist with the DNR and Jim Donahoe of Aquatic Weed Control. The following were the main topics of discussion:

1. We have a very long record of scientific weed sampling data compared to other Indiana lakes. The records show great annual variation in Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) dominance in the lake. For example, "none" in 2007 (after the full lake SONAR treatment) to large amounts in 2012 & 2014. See www.dewartlake.org for the data.
2. The data also shows that the lake has a large variety of native weeds compared to other Indiana lakes--13 to 15 different species are found most years. These native weeds, in appropriate amounts, are necessary for a healthy lake and fishery. Non-native weeds, especially EWM, that in some years crowd our native species, have been the focus of the DLPA's weed control programs (herbicides before 2012 and weevils since).
3. Rod & Jim agreed t there is probably as much *acreage* of EWM as there will *ever be* since it is now growing in nearly all of its preferred muddy bottom areas that are less than 20 feet deep. The 4 year weevil program has been an attempt to keep the EWM from "topping out" rather than trying to kill it with herbicides.
4. Next year, 2015, we will continue with the last year of the weevil program that has been 80% funded by the DNR. No new weevils will be placed next year, but the annual weevil and weevil damage surveys will continue enabling a final weevil program evaluation by the DNR and the DLPA. Herbicide use permit requests made by shoreline owners and applicators will be evaluated once again on a case by case basis by the DNR.
5. The DNR will fund a major lake wide study in 2015 that will result in an "Aquatic Vegetation Management Plan". This plan will make recommendations on how we should proceed with our "nuisance weed" control program.

Thank you once again to Travis Harris for donating his time and material to repair the sign posts on our road sign on 300E. Thank you for doing the leg work to have the sign made.
